## Attending Football Games



**Gator football games are great! There's nothing like spending a fall Saturday at the Swamp, but there are some important things fans need to know. The following are some simple rules to help YOU have a great time!**

### **Remember:**

- NO alcoholic beverages are permitted in the stadium.
- Flags, airhorns, and umbrellas are prohibited in the stadium.
- Fans should be cautious of purchasing tickets from strangers, as counterfeit tickets have been a problem at some past games.
- Switching tickets or sitting in a seat/section other than your assigned seat/section is prohibited.
- Scalping--selling a ticket on the University of Florida campus--is prohibited.
- Throwing objects, including paper and plastic cups, is a safety hazard and is prohibited.
- Rowdy, threatening, or inconsiderate behavior such as standing in the aisles, portals, or concourses; profane and abusive language; smoking in public areas; fighting; and drunkenness, will not be tolerated and can result in ejection, arrest, and/or loss of season ticket privileges.

Violations of the law and stadium rules can result in being ejected from the game, loss of future ticket privileges, referral to Student Judicial Affairs, and/or arrest. ### **Game Day Safety Tips**

- Don't let "tailgaters" into your dorm! Even if they seem friendly, don't let unauthorized visitors follow you into your residence hall.
- Don't prop open self-locking doors. It may seem convenient, but that moment of opportunity is all that a criminal needs!
- Be aware that according to UF policy, "tailgaters" are not allowed to draw power from UF sources. Don't allow "tailgaters" to plug extension cords into UF outlets.
